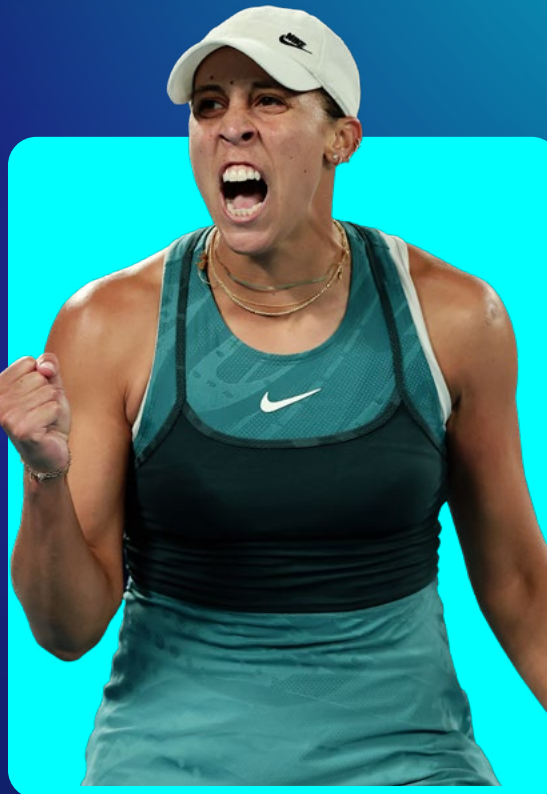

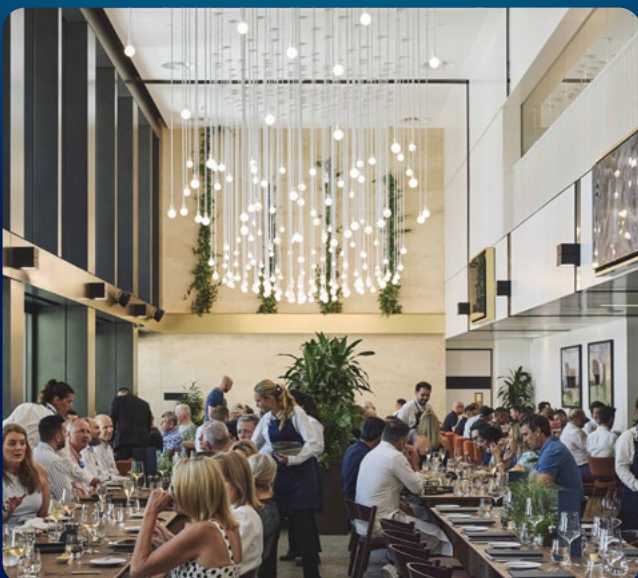

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ICONIC SITES ACROSS MELBOURNE

HOSIER LANE

STREET ART

Hosier Lane is one of the many celebrated laneways in Melbourne. Showcasing large street-art murals and beautiful bluestone pavements, as well as hidden cafes and bars, it is a site that all visitors to Melbourne must see. With the option to take a stroll at your own pace and explore the colour and uniqueness of the laneway, or to join various walking tours who will give you insights on the artists and their work, there is something for everyone.

Make sure you pass by sister lane, Rutledge Lane, which gives you a similar experience.

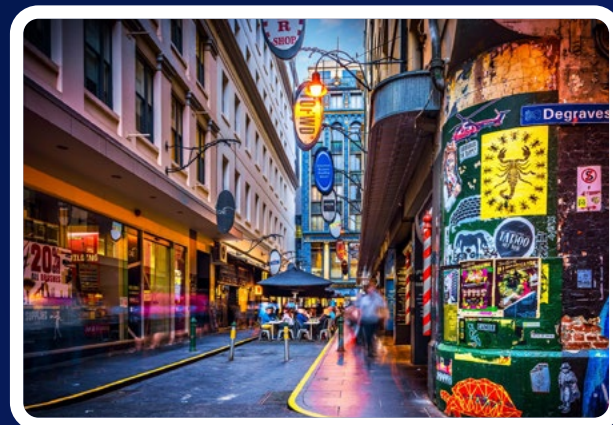

DEGRAVES STREET

CAFES, COFFEE, PLACES TO EAT

Located conveniently off Flinders Lane, head down the bustling Degraves Street, the coffee and café central of Melbourne. Enjoy Australian breakfasts including the famous 'smashed avocado' on warm sourdough, or tuck into a sweet treat like a delicious pastry and almond croissant. Cafés to try on this strip include Degraves Espresso, The Quarter, or the nearby Instagram-favourite Dukes and many more which specialise in brewing some of the best coffee in Melbourne. Local Tip: For those into their underground coffee scene, ask for a 'magic' – unique to Melbourne's rich coffee culture or head 10 minutes out of the CBD to Good Measure in Carlton, known for their 'Mont Blanc', another uniquely Melbourne brew consisting of cold brew coffee, a layer of aerated cream and decorated with orange zest and nutmeg.



The atmosphere of this cool street doesn't stop there, with lots of shops to explore including Clementine's where you can find some amazing locally-made gifts and artisan goods, or stop by the BeeKeeper Parade pop-up – everything at this social enterprise is upcycled from textiles otherwise headed for landfill and every purchase supports children in Cambodia. A bag that's good for people, animals and the planet – make a 'beeline!'

CHINATOWN

Follow the colourful lanterns and bright lights to Little Bourke Street, where you will find Australia's oldest Chinatown. Established in the 1850's during Victoria's Gold Rush, Chinatown was settled by Chinese immigrants, and over 170 years on, you can locate some of the best yum cha, dumplings and hotpots in Melbourne.

There is more to Chinatown than just food – you will find hidden bars, karaoke, arcades, fashion shops and so much more.

📍 Eastern end of Little Bourke Street, Melbourne, VIC 3000, consisting of numerous laneways.

QUEEN VICTORIA MARKETS

The Queen Victoria Market has been operational since 1878 and has been a central city hub for fresh produce, culturally diverse food trucks and amazing products from small businesses across Victoria. Commonly known as the 'Queen Vic' or 'Vic Market', the historic landmark still operates today five days a week (Tuesday, Thursday – Sunday). Make sure to check out the daily opening hours.

ROYAL BOTANIC GARDENS VICTORIA

A green sanctuary on the edge of the CBD, Royal Botanic Gardens Melbourne has been shaping the city's cultural landscape for nearly 180 years. Spanning 38 hectares, the Gardens showcase more than 8,500 plant species from around the world and sit moments from Melbourne's iconic arts and cultural precinct.

ARTS AND CULTURE

ACMI

(Australian Centre for the Moving Image)

Known as the Museum of Screen Culture, take a step into the world of screen-based art, film, TV and videogames. Located in Federation Square (across from Flinders Street Station), the space welcomes a mix of exhibitions, including the current Game Worlds Exhibition, screenings, festivals and commissions. With something for everyone, check out their events calendar in January by heading to their website.

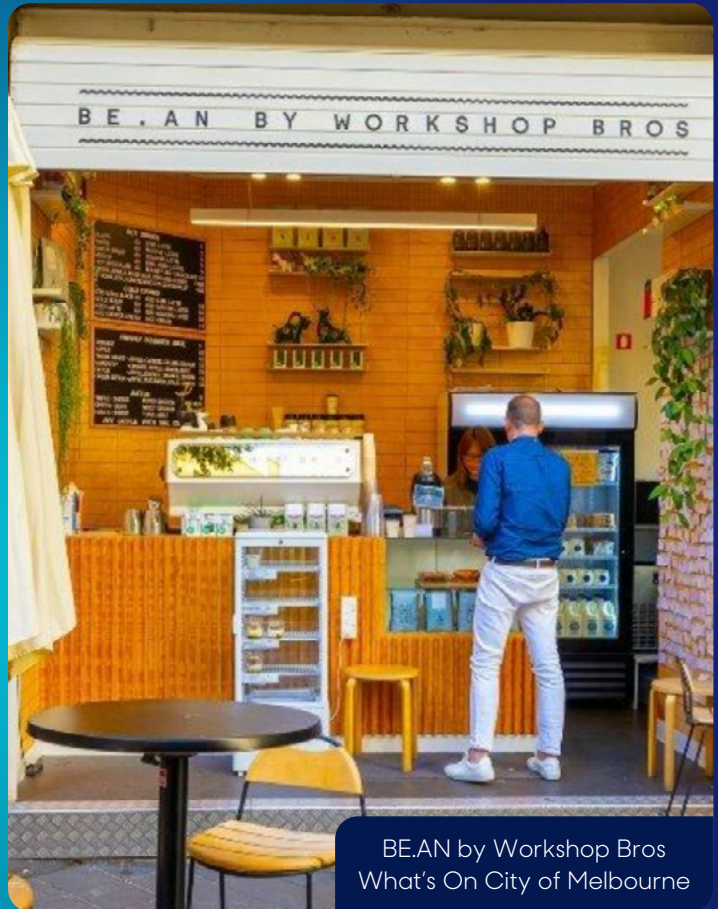

The bar is located upstairs, where you will find a tall staircase and a bookshelf – the rest we will leave up to you! From there, you will find a special retreat where you can unwind from the day's tennis play and enjoy some great drinks.

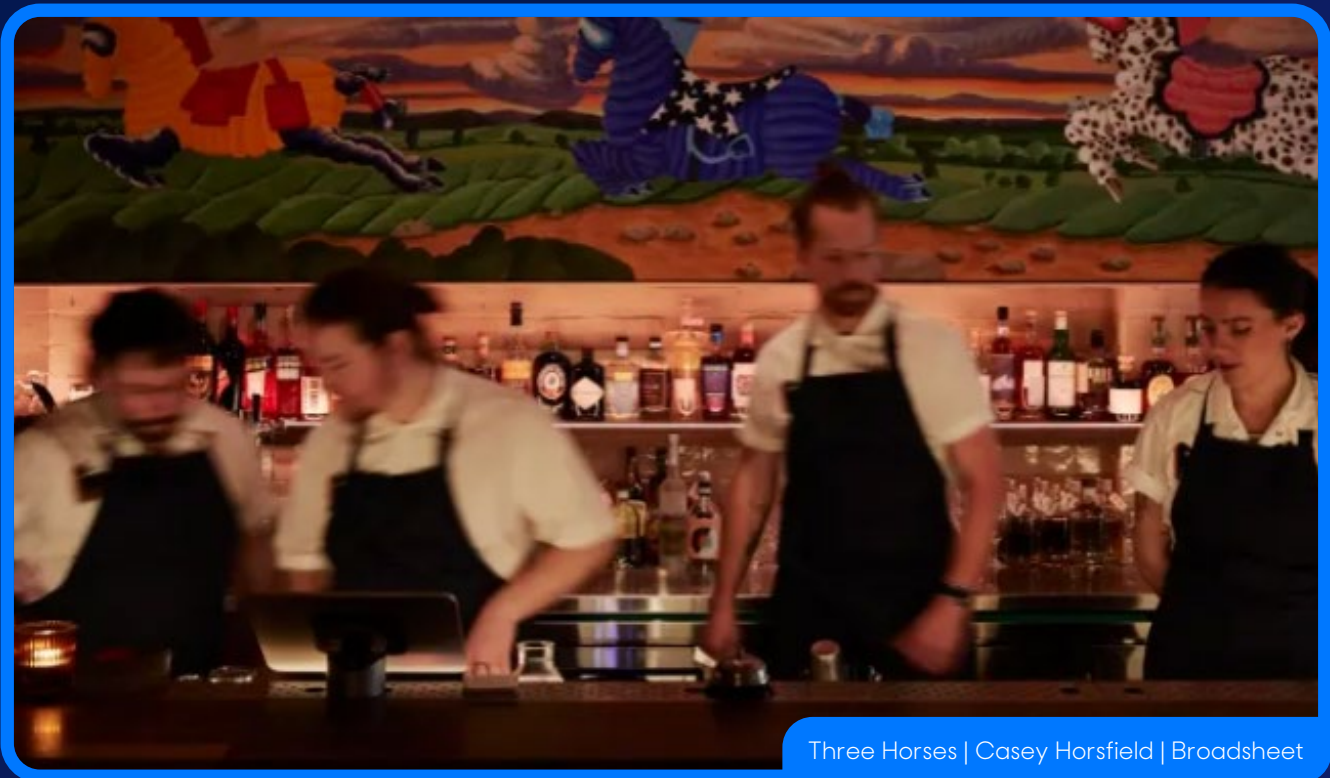
Fall From Grace/ State of Grace Secret Bookcase Bar

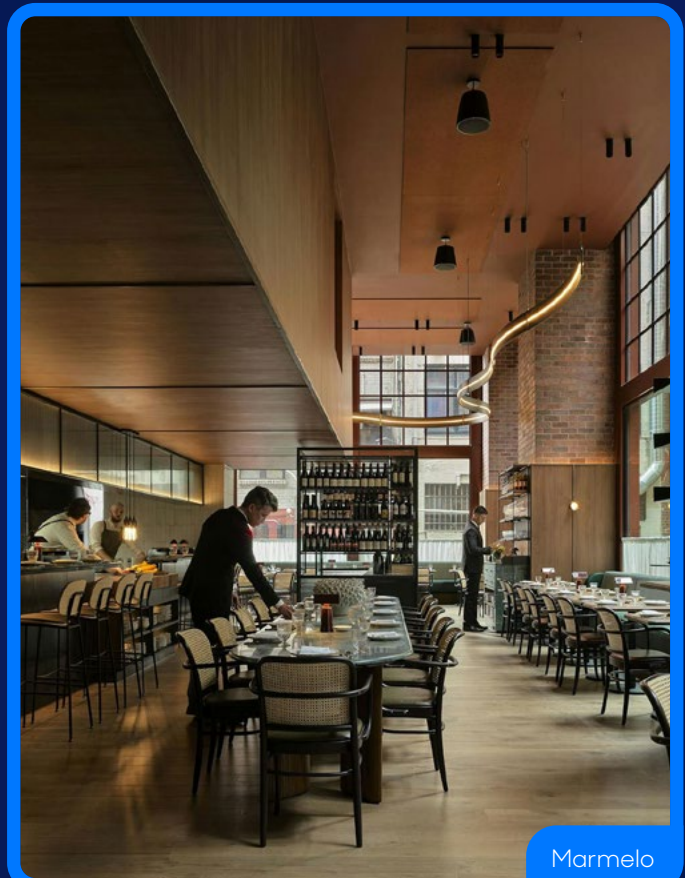

LYGON ST, CARLTON

One of the more renowned food and wine inner city suburbs in Melbourne, walkable from the city or Parliament Station (Melbourne) or accessible by trams 1 and 6.

Known for its gorgeous Italian cuisine, artsy cafes – more notably Good Measure, who created the viral Mont Blanc, and beautiful roof top bars and gardens, it's definitely a place to visit whilst staying in Melbourne.

When visiting Lygon St in particular, you must go to:

Good Measure – try their Mont Blanc, another uniquely Melbourne brew consisting of cold brew coffee, a layer of aerated cream and decorated with orange zest and nutmeg.

Johnny's Green Room – A sophisticated rooftop oasis in Carlton, blending Italian flair with Melbourne edge – where refined cocktails and sweeping city views create an effortlessly vibrant experience above Lygon Street.

Tiamo – A Carlton institution, serving traditional, home-style Italian meals for the last 40 years.



ST KILDA

The iconic seaside suburb located 7km outside the Melbourne CBD is one to visit during the Aussie summer whilst you are visiting Melbourne.

Best way to get to St Kilda is either by Tram (directions on how to use the Tram can be found in our Transportation section) or by Uber. When visiting St Kilda, you must visit:

Stokehouse & Stokehouse Bar – Two levels of synonymous with Australian beach luxe. Offering laid back charm, overlooking the water, with a vibrant atmosphere, welcome feel and generosity, matched with an award winning food and wine offer.

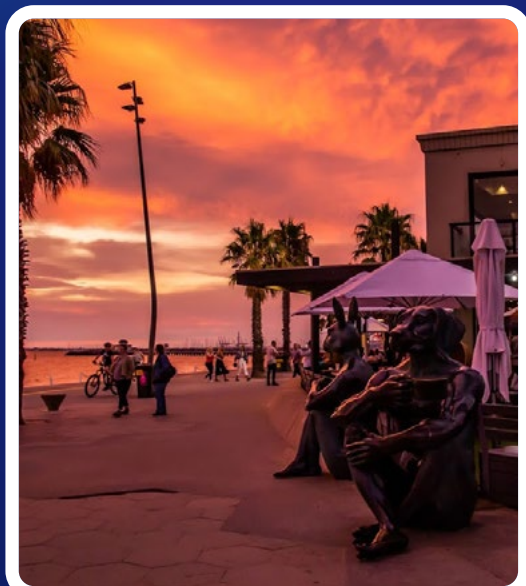
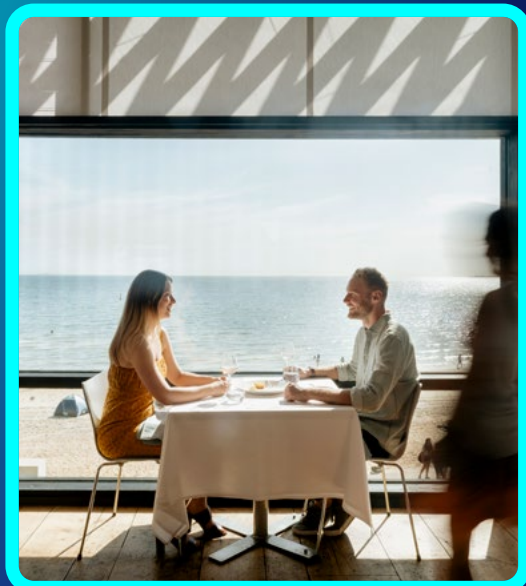

TRANSPORT

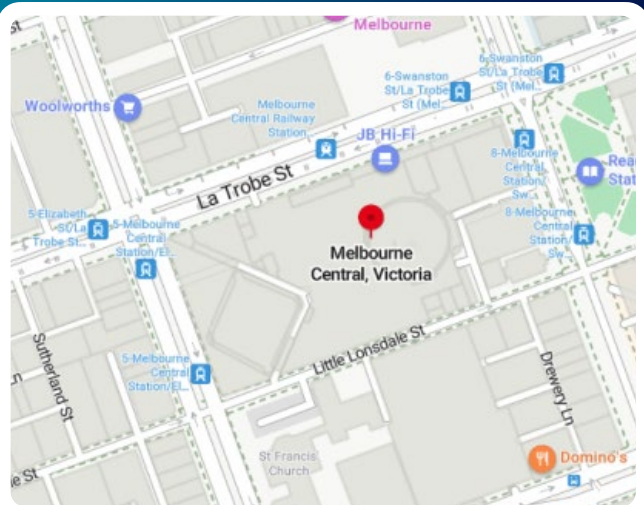
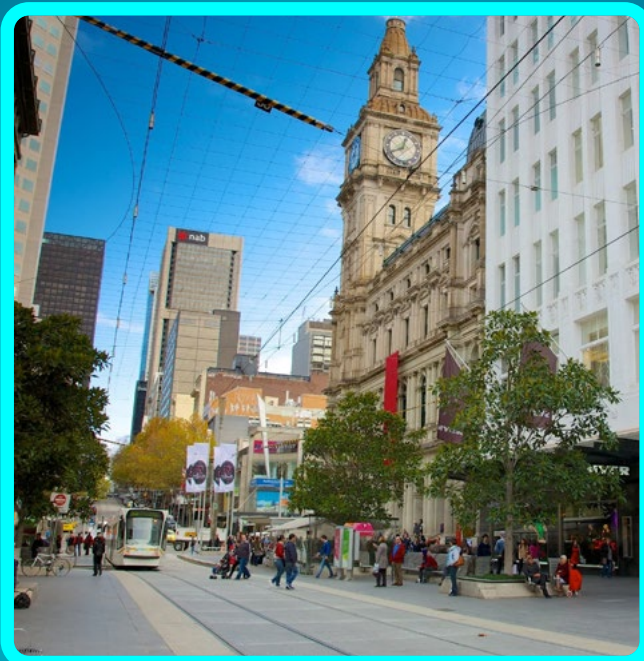
The best way to travel around Melbourne is via the Melbourne public transport system. With multiple ways to get to the Australian Open, make sure you are sorted with a Myki card which you will need for public transport travel. The Myki card costs \$6 to purchase. These can be purchased at Myki machines, train station kiosks and some retail outlets including 7-Eleven.

AO Travel & Experiences customers looking to travel to the Australian Open via a tram, can do so for free (as long as they have a ticket for that particular day) on Route 70 and 70a between Stop D6 Flinders St West to 7C MCG Gates 4-7.

For travel around Melbourne CBD, you can travel for free again in the Free Tram Zone. You will hear announcements if you are travelling in the Free Tram Zone and when you are leaving. If you are heading outside of the CBD, you will need to have a working Myki. The Myki card will cover you across trams, trains and buses throughout Victoria. When taking public transport, you will need to 'touch on' before your journey begins and 'touch off' when you are at your destination.

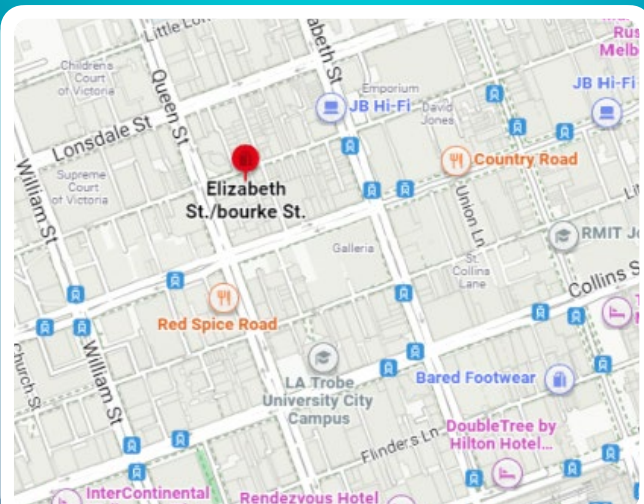
SHOPPING



Melbourne Central

Known for its iconic Coop's Shot Tower inside the bustling shopping centre, Melbourne Central has everything you need, from floors of retail stores, cafés and restaurants, cinemas and much more.

Melbourne Central has an extensive history, and houses The Coop Shot Tower, which is a significant building in Australia's industrial history. The shopping centre was built around this tower and has helped preserve this historical building. It is a sight to see!



Bourke Street Mall

Bourke Street Mall, located in the heart of the CBD, hosts many major fashion brands and businesses including the brand-new Mecca, Myer, Zara, H&M, David Jones and much more. Not like your traditional mall, it is located outdoors allowing for visitors to walk and discover new shops whilst enjoying the Melbourne weather.

With a tram line separating either side of the strip, accessing Bourke Street Mall is easy!
